BUILDING BURIEN

Investing in Community Through Parks and Public Works Projects

The City of Burien is working on or has recently completed the following infrastructure projects in Burien this year.

Miller Creek Daylighting Project

Near S 144th St and Des Moines Memorial Drive S

Project status: Project design complete. Construction began in May 2023.

S 140th St Trunkline Project

S 140th St between 8th Ave S and Des Moines Memorial Dr S

Project status: Project design is complete. Construction is expected to begin in fall 2023.

Pavement Management Program

Manhattan neighborhood, SW 160th St & S 160th St (as well as citywide pothole repairs)

Project status: Construction will take place August-September 2023.

S 136th St Sidewalk Improvements

S 136th St between 1st Ave S and Des Moines Memorial Drive S

Project status: Project construction has been awarded to R. L. Alia. Construction began in April 2023.

Manhattan Park Playground Improvements

18386 4th Ave S

Project status: Construction will take place in fall 2023.

ORDINANCES

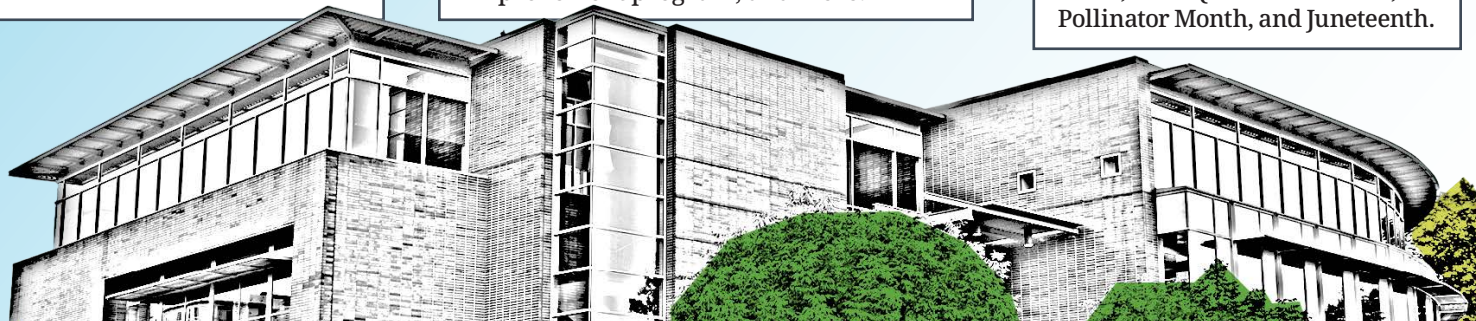
The City Council passed Ordinance Nos. 812-815. The ordinances covered many topics including zoning updates near transit stations on Ambaum Blvd SW and minor amendments to budget.

RESOLUTIONS

The City Council passed Resolution Nos. 493-500. The resolutions covered many topics including subdivision approvals for Sapphire Homes and La Serra Subdivision, updates to the rules governing the Burien Airport Committee, addition of ecoTHRIVE to Affordable Housing Demonstration Program, adoption of a six-year transportation improvement program, and more.

PROCLAMATIONS

The City Council issued 13 proclamations on the following topics: Women's History Month, Recognition of Adriene Buckley's 30 Years of Service, Sexual Assault Awareness Month, Citizen of the Year, Earth Day, Arbor Day, Mental Health Awareness Month, Jewish American Heritage Month, Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander Heritage Month, Older Americans Month, Peace Officer Memorial Day, Affordable Housing Week, LGBTQIA+ Pride Month, Pollinator Month, and Juneteenth.

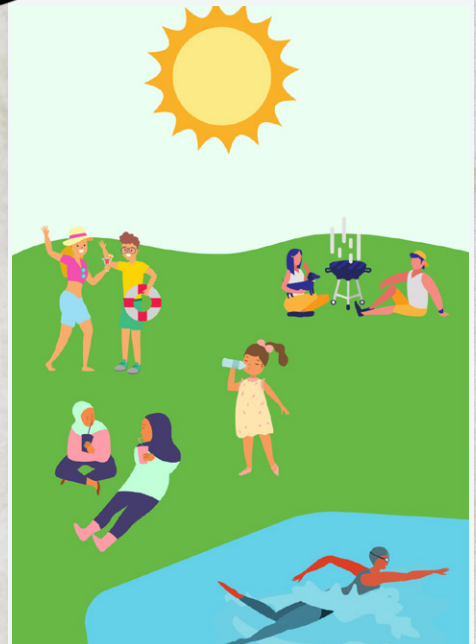

Application for Utility Tax Relief Due in December

July 5, 2023

The City of Burien's Utility Tax Relief Program offers rebates on certain utility taxes paid toward the following services: water, sewer, solid waste removal provided by Recology Cleanscapes, electricity provided by Puget Sound Energy, telephone (including cellular), and basic cable television. Applications are due by December 15, 2023. Rebates will be issued by the end of February 2024.

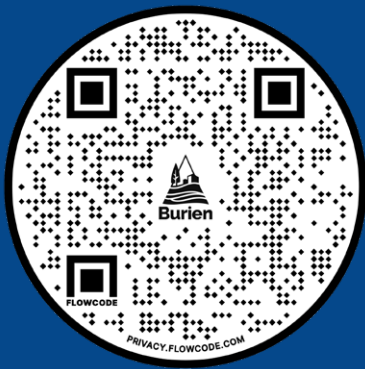
